1. Chair Silver called the meeting to order at 5:30 p.m.
2. Members present were Chair Silver and Alderperson Abraham. Alderperson Menke was absent. Also present were Administrator Krider, Street Department Manager Hess, Alderpersons Dohm, Mathewson, and Ruskusky, residents Marlene Carter and Priscilla Peterson, and Clerk Barnes. Resident Susan Schlupp attended remotely.
3. There were no Additions to/or Deletions from the Agenda.
4. A Motion to approve the Minutes from the **May 15, 2024** regular meeting was made by Alderperson Abraham and seconded by Chair Silver. **Motion carried.**
5. A Motion to receive and file the Monthly Financial Reports from **April 2024** was made by Alderperson Abraham and seconded by Chair Silver. **Motion carried.**
6. The City Administrator's Report included the traffic safety survey on Waverly Avenue is in process with the data collectors on poles there. We are waiting for the results.
7. Street Department Manager's Report:
 - a. Sidewalk Project Report: The Sidewalk Project on Downs Circle is more than half done along with the wrap around on Sterling. The goal is to have the sidewalks done by the 4th of July Parade. The mill and overlay will be done after the parade.
 - b. Vaughn / Magnolia Project Report – There is nothing new to report at this time.
 - c. Other: There was a walk-through for the Moss/Sterling/Ayres project from last year. It looks good except for painting that did not last 5 months. Varsity has been contacted about the situation and UCM has also been contacted to help get a resolution for the problem painting.
8. Public Comment: Question: Can the City post on their website when street/sidewalk projects will be done so the residents can respond accordingly? Yes.
9. Unfinished Business:
 - a. **Traffic and Safety** at Harold B. Dawson School – District 150 is out for the summer at the end of the week and hopefully the painting of the crosswalks can be completed before the staff and students return near the end of July.
 - b. **FY 2025 Goals & Objectives:** Goals have been broad in the past because so much can change. **The goals will remain on the agendas for each meeting and the topic will return next month when Alderperson Menke will be present. Administrator Krider asked the Committee to watch for possible objectives that can be added to the goals.**
One such was brought forward this evening of adding an objective to goal #2 – to review the storm sewer map annually.

10. New Business:


