Crusens II has had a couple of walk-throughs each week and a couple of other times when the police were called down there for disorderly conduct and Liquor Control Act problems.

Deputy Gilmore wanted to thank the West Peoria Fire Department which did a great job the night of the Radan Court fire. Three Deputies were on the scene: Deputy Weinder, Lt. Zuck, Deputy Visserling – if you see them, thank them, they did a great job. The police are still trying to find other citizens that were there to help.

One question was asked about cars that had been side-swiped the weekend of Father's Day. Deputy Gilmore will look into what happened.
