- 3. There were no Additions to/or Deletions from the Agenda.
- 4. A Motion to approve the Minutes of the May 18, 2022 regular meeting was made by Alderperson Thomas and seconded by Chair Silver. **Motion carried.**

The street crew has been testing a 2018 side-by-side that was used for sweeping on Sterling Hill, has several other functions that can be used like a salt-spreader, snowplow, weed-sprayer, and has a small dump box. They will be using it for another week to see how it performs.

The 4<sup>th</sup> of July Parade Route has been sprayed for weeds.

The sidewalks on Ardmore that were done last year are not in good condition. ICCI (Illinois Civil Contractors) is being contacted to request a replacement. It was requested that **the Committee be updated next month about this.** 

Alderperson Edmonds joined the meeting in person at 5:37 p.m.

#### 8. Public Comment

Please continue to alert the community about street sweeping, etc. It helps.

It was good to have the information about street sweeping, and all the cars on my street parked off street, but then Waste Management came along and put all the totes in the street. What can be done about that? They've been contacted four times by e-mail, the next will be a formal letter of complaint. What about ADA requirements?

The Detour signs for Swords Hill seem to be working. Maybe only the weekend traffic wasn't paying attention to the signage.

From last month's meeting and talking about saving parking spaces in congested areas, what about the use of bike racks? We have bike lanes on our streets, but nowhere to park those bikes. We wouldn't need many, just a few strategically placed around areas that are more congested like City Hall, Haddad's, by the Owl's Nest or Tartan Inn. There are many different kinds, and they only cost between \$350-\$450. They come in differ strengths and even in color! It's also a good idea for our IEPA goals. (Illinois Environmental Protection Agency) less emissions.

# 9. Unfinished Business

- a. Radar Data Review This month's review was of Laura from Waverly to Western in both directions, and Alice from Waverly to Western. Laura had a surprising number of vehicles and speeders at 3 p.m. and 12:30 a.m. Data will continue to be gathered and a determination of where to go with that data will be made at a later date.
- b. IEPA Goals(Illinois Environmental Protection Agency) Section C It was decided that the most important part that needs to be addressed at this time is the Storm Sewer Mapping. Administrator Krider will contact Bradley University to see if their engineering students/interns could help in this endeavor. If they cannot, perhaps Tri-County Regional Planning Commission could help with grants or other suggestions. It was noted that the Street Department cleans the storm sewer basins regularly. It was requested that a kind of calendar be kept to share with the Committee. It was also noted that the City does a lot of Public Notification about storm sewer issues through various ways like the Newsletter, website and community page on Facebook.
- c. Rebuild Illinois Funds discussion differentiated between this program and the ARPA funding program. These funds must be used for a bondable project that follows MFT (Motor Fuel Tax) guidelines. A recommendation will be made to the Committee before going on to Council.
- d. ARPA (American Rescue Plan Act) Funds discussion included the possibility of using the funds for the Vaughn/Magnolia project. There was a reminder that all ideas for the use of these funds need to be turned in at next month's meeting.
   It was also requested that the Vaugh/Magnolia project be returned to the agenda next month so the Committee will be able to be updated on its progress.

### 10. New Business:
