FISCAL YEAR 2023 GOALS

1. Continue the new sidewalk program and persist with ongoing sidewalk repairs.
2. Coordinate the engineering aspect of the Nirvana Gardens Project.
3. Pursue storm sewer improvement projects as needed and on Richmond Avenue.
4. Pursue projects to continually improve roads and alleys throughout the City.
5. Work with the Finance Committee and investigate possibilities where TIF funds can be used to support public infrastructure projects.
6. Continue working on Illinois Environmental Protection Agency/National Pollution Discharge Elimination System & Storm Water Management Plan (IEPA – NPDES – SWMP).
 - a. Complete GIS storm sewer mapping
7. Research other cities, similar in size and potentially develop alternative (outside-the-box) solutions to issues we are dealing with.
8. Continue to work with Residents' Association and fellow Council members on City-wide initiatives, specific to transportation.
9. Continue working with Public Safety to Slow Down West Peoria.
10. Develop a plan and project list for Rebuild IL funds to best serve the Community.
11. Develop and maintain a 5–10-year plan for Street Department types of equipment and vehicles.



Transportation Committee Official Minutes

Tuesday, April 19, 2022 at 5:30 p.m.

1. Chair Silver called the meeting to order at 5:30 p.m.
2. Members present were Chair Silver and Alderperson Thomas. Alderperson Edmonds attended online as did Alderperson Mathewson and resident Priscilla Peterson. Also present were Mayor Dillon, City Administrator Krider, Public Works Manager Hess, Alderpersons Abraham and Dohm, resident Nick Baker, and Clerk Barnes.
3. There were no Additions to/or Deletions from the Agenda.
4. A Motion to approve the Minutes of the March 16, 2022 regular meeting was made by Alderperson Thomas and seconded by Alderperson Edmonds. **Motion carried.**
5. A Motion to receive and file the Monthly Financial Report for February 2022 was made by Alderperson Thomas and seconded by Alderperson Edmonds. **Motion carried.**
6. There was no Administrator's Report.
7. Public Works Manager's Report included that all the streets and sidewalks (except Idaho that was under construction at the time) have been swept, and the drywells have been cleared out. The new Street Sweeper now has the City Logo on it. All of the dumpsters for Spring Clean-Up Day on April 30, 2022 will be delivered next week.
8. No Public Comment was offered.
9. Unfinished Business
 - a. IEPA Goals (Illinois Environmental Protection Agency). There was a handout given with the Best Management Practices which have been implemented in the past or are proposed to be implemented in the future. The Committee looked at Section A on Public Education and Outreach. It was suggested to add the Spring Clean-Up Day and the Walk-the-Wards litter pick-up days to the list. A5 may be removed as we really do not do any classroom education at this time. **The Committee is to look over Section B for next month's meeting.**
 - b. FY2023 Meeting dates and times will remain on the third Wednesday of each month with the starting time of 5:30p.m.
 - c. Rebuild Illinois funds and possible projects: There will be about \$303,000.00 to spend on projects. We prefer to spend it all at one time, even if it is for several different projects. The paperwork and reporting would be easier to do all at once rather than a bit here, and a bit there. Some engineering fees can be included on some projects if needed. The City is looking to finish one area of the City at a time as opposed to a little bit here and there. **Administrator Krider is going to send out letters from IDOT (Illinois Department of Transportation) that include some suggestions for use of these monies so Committee members can begin thinking of possible projects.**

During this discussion both Alderperson Reagan and resident Bonnie Farrell joined the meeting.

10. There was No New Business.

11. Public Comment: There is a concern that a couple of places on Rohmann Avenue are being parked in the No Parking zone of Rohmann Avenue. Having called County Police has not resulted in any change. **Administrator Krider will have Code Enforcement check into this complaint.**

12. A Motion to Adjourn was made by Alderperson Thomas at 5:51 p.m. and seconded by Alderperson Edmonds. **Motion carried.**
