1. Continue new sidewalk program and persist with on-going sidewalk repairs
2. Coordinate the engineering aspect of the Babu project.
3. Pursue storm sewer improvement projects as needed and on Richmond Ave
4. Pursue projects to continually improve roads and alleys throughout the City
5. Work with the Finance Committee and investigate possibilities where TIF funds can be used to support public infrastructure projects.
6. Continue working on Illinois Environmental Protection Agency/National Pollution Discharge Elimination System & Storm Water Management Plan (IEPA – NPDES – SWMP)
7. Research other cities, similar in size to that of WP and potentially develop alternative (outside the box- solutions to issues we are dealing with.
8. Continue to work with resident’s association and fellow Council members on City wide initiatives, specific to transportation.

1. Chair Silver called the meeting to order at 5:30 p.m.
2. Members present were Chair Silver, Alderpersons Thomas, and Edmonds. Also present were Alderpersons Dohm and Abraham, resident Priscilla Peterson, and Clerk Barnes. Public Works Manager Strube attended remotely.
3. There were no Additions to/or Deletions from Agenda.
4. A Motion to Approve the Minutes of the June 15, 2021 meeting was made by Alderperson Thomas and seconded by Alderperson Edmonds. **Motion carried.**
5. A Motion to Receive and File the Financial Reports for May 2021 was made by Alderperson Thomas and seconded by Alderperson Edmonds. **Motion carried.**
6. Public Comment: There is a link on the West Peoria Community page that one citizen would like us to look at because he says that the research that was done by Priscilla Peterson about speed bumps, humps, etc. is outdated.
7. Reports:
 - a. Public Works Manager's Report – was not given.
8. There was no Unfinished Business, although there was a question about Slow Down West Peoria being taken off the agenda. Are we finished with this project by putting out a few flags?
What about a report on the Vaughn and Magnolia Project?
Mayor Dillon joined the meeting at 5:35.
9. New Business
 - a. Review Radar Sign Data: Two streets – Rohmann from Ashland to Swords and Heading from Edgehill to Sterling were the only streets recorded. It was commented that there doesn't seem to be much of an issue with speeding. Another comment was that the 5 mph over the posted speed limit was happening a lot, but not many more at 10 mph over, and fewer at the 15 mph over the posted limit. If we lowered the speed limits on all streets by 5 mph, that might work to get them to what we want.
Mayor Dillon spoke to the Mayor's Association about the issue, and everyone is complaining about the same. The other mayors all feel that their municipalities only get compliance with the issuing of tickets.
10. Public Comment: Mayor Dillon commented on the Vaughn/Magnolia project. A couple of weeks ago he and the Public Works Manager Strube walked the ditch with 4 engineers. They will be getting back with their suggestions. He shared pictures that he took during the walk with the committee. Alderperson Thomas reported that CORE Construction is working on her street. They knocked out her mailbox but replaced it. Would Public Works Manager Strube please look into what's happening on Richmond Street?

11. A Motion to Adjourn was made by Alderperson Thomas at 5:45 p.m. and seconded by Alderperson Edmonds. **Motion carried.**
